### Paradise Corner

One of my favorite stories in the Bible is the story of the "Road to Emmaus." (Emmaus here is the city seven miles from Jerusalem, not the one in Pennsylvania!) We find the story at Luke 24:13–35. The version I will tell here shortened is from the Spark Story Bible (Augsburg Fortress, 2009, pp. 488–491).

Three days after Jesus died, Cleopas and his friend were slowly walking down the road to Emmaus. They were walking slowly because the felt very sad. [...] After a while, a stranger began to walk along with them. The stranger was really Jesus, but Cleopas and his friend didn't know it.

"What are you talking about?" the stranger asked. The men looked at each other. "Are you the only person in town who doesn't know what just happened?" they asked. They told the stranger what had happened to Jesus. "Jesus was a great teacher," Cleopas said. "We hoped he was the one God promised would save the world, but instead he died on a cross! [...] This morning, our friends went to the tomb, but Jesus' body was gone! They said there was an angel there instead! The angel told our friends, 'Jesus is alive," but..."

"Stop being silly!" the stranger said. "How many times do you need to hear this? It was God's plan for Jesus to die and become alive again to save the world!"

By now, they were almost to Emmaus. Cleopas invited the stranger to stay for dinner. During dinner, the stranger picked up a loaf of bread, broke it, blessed it, and gave each man a piece. All of a sudden, Cleopas and his friend recognize the stranger. It was Jesus, but then Jesus disappeared! Cleopas and his friend jumped up, ran from the room, and went to tell the rest of Jesus' disciples that Jesus really was alive!

I believe this story can help us when we feel the despair of having lost hope. That is a feeling that makes us sad. Part of the challenge, of course, is that we live in a world that—as Jesus pretended—does not know the story of God's plan to save the world. We live together as ones who gather around that story—in Word of God and in the Holy Meal. And—it is simply because of that story that we have hope in the midst of the confusion around us.

I also believe that one way to help settle the confusion is to work together with one another. This first involves spending time (as Cleopas and his companion did), but it goes beyond that to contributing our gifts (particularly time and talent) to the work of God. Cleopas and his companion did this too in the making of the meal they shared with Christ. The result, of course, was that their willingness to share helped inform all the friends of Jesus.

When we work together, even though we may feel confused and disoriented, we actually are not. God's plan to save the world has already saved us and invites us to help others join in the excitement that Jesus really is alive.

Saint Paul's is pleased to announce the introduction of an electronic option for

making regular offerings. Contributions can now be debited automatically from your checking or savings account. Our new electronic giving program offers convenience for you and much-needed donation consistency for our congregation.

These secure donation services, which Saint Paul's is receiving without the normal start-up fees for the first year, are provided by Vanco Services, LLC. Vanco processes electronic donations for thousands of churches and nonprofit organizations.
